Standards. The Navajo Angora Goat being recorded should be **at least one year of age**. NAGs should have a **clean face and legs below the knees**; fleece type should have **little or no grease content and a high luster**; fleece should **cover the entire body from jaw to tail**. A permanent form of ID (ear tag or tattoo) is recommended.

Your Farm ID. A copy of the record for each of your recorded NAGs will be mailed to you (in the SASE) with your record number reflecting your farm ID in front of their name (i.e.: CF Sam, CF Daisy). If you do not have a farm ID, you can list 3 choices (2-4 letters) and the first one that isn't taken by another farm will be assigned to you.

Black With Gray Tips	Lightbelly or Reverse Badger (dark body, light facial stipes, belly & legs)
Black	Mantled (dark neck/shoulders, light rear, facial stripes)
Faded Red (colored at birth fading to near white adult)	Peacock (light front, dark back/rear, facial stripes)
Cream / Apricot	Tog (dark body, belly, light facial & leg stripes)
Medium Red / Copper Red	White with Colored Fibers
Taupe / Silvery Brown	Pinto (colored and white patches)
Chocolate Brown	Belted (white band completely around middle)
